Dr. Stuart Bell will receive the 2021 Matthew F. McNulty, Jr. Award, July 14, 2022 at Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Maryland.

The Healthcare Council Board approved the nomination of Dr. Bell by a unanimous vote in May, 2022. His name was presented by Bradley S. Chambers, Senior Vice President & Chief Operating Officer Baltimore Region, MedStar Health.

The Healthcare Council's 10th Employee of the Year and 23rd McNulty Awards Luncheon

Forty-six employees and/or teams will be presented a crystal award. Recognition is given to those who made a significant contribution in healthcare in 2021 and is based on three criteria: Sustainability, Quality, and Customer/Patient Satisfaction. The narratives about each recipient are awe-inspiring. Honorees are physicians, nurses, painters, cashiers, food service directors, lab technicians, environmental services employees, benefits managers, receptionists, engineers, supply chain leaders, executive assistants and more. Each employee is part of a team and every associate makes a difference.

The awards celebration is about honoring those who have in some way in 2021 excelled in the work they do. All healthcare workers and associates have been heroes during these past two and one half years. The individuals and team members being recognized July 14 stand out in a special way, meeting all the criteria required. Save the date and join us from 12 noon to 2:00 PM as we recognize those whose passion and dedication have made a difference in the communities they serve.

The Matthew F. McNulty Award was created on the 24th day of September, 1997 in honor of Dr. McNulty for his 20-plus years as a leader on the Board of The Healthcare Council and his exemplary contributions to the healthcare field. The McNulty 2021 recipient, Dr. Stuart B Bell, has served as the vice president of medical affairs for MedStar Union Memorial Hospital since 2003, and previously served as the hospital's chief of staff. In 2018, Dr. Bell assumed the integrated role of vice president of medical affairs for both MedStar Union Memorial and MedStar Good Samaritan Hospital.

Prior to joining MedStar Union Memorial, Bell was the director of employee health service and medical consultant for the Children's Hospital for Reconstructive Surgery, medical director and physician in chief for Brightwood Health Center, and served as a consultant for the Baltimore City Health Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He has also held teaching roles at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, MedStar Union Memorial Hospital, MedStar Good Samaritan Hospital and Greater Baltimore Medical Center.

Bell has a bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Maryland, and a doctorate in medicine from the University of Maryland School of Medicine. He is a member of the Medical and Chirurgical Society of the House of Delegates, a fellow for the American College of Physicians, and a fellow for the American College of Physicians Executives.

As a tireless advocate for community health and the Executive Sponsor of Care Transformation for MedStar Health in the Baltimore Region he has championed numerous initiatives aimed at supporting patients and improving the health and well-being of communities served. Most recently, under Dr. Bell's leadership, MedStar launched a Health and Wellness Center at the J. Van Story Branch Apartments, a low-income apartment complex in Baltimore City serving hundreds of residents with medical needs. He also serves on the Board of Directors for Shepherd's Clinic, a free, not for profit clinic for uninsured residents.

Dr. Bell is a selfless, enthusiastic physician devoted to those he serves ensuring compassionate care of the highest quality.

We look forward to recognizing Dr. Bell and his contributions to the healthcare industry on July 14, 2022 at our Employee of the Year and Matthew F. McNulty, Jr. Awards Luncheon.

75th Anniversary Gala Highlights

What a grand, magical evening we had at our 75th Anniversary Gala at the Bethesda North Marriott in Bethesda, Maryland on May 11, 2022. Attendees donned their best apparel and celebrated 75 years of The Healthcare Council with the theme, "Celebrating the Past & Looking Toward the Future." Gala Committee Chair, Calvin Brown opened the evening by introducing our Mistress and Master of Ceremonies, WUSA9 Powerful Duo, Allison Seymour and Marc Clarke. Board Chair, Kathy Gorman and Vice Chair of The Healthcare Council participated throughout the evening and Chaplin Thomas Chirido, Director of the Department of Mission and Pastoral Care, MedStar Georgetown University Hospital had the invocation.

Three hundred twenty-nine friends, family, and co-workers mingled while being entertained by the Northwell Health Nurse Choir, the choir that advanced to the Season 16 Finale of 'America's Got Talent' in September of 2021

after receiving the coveted Golden Buzzer from show judge, Howie Mandel. The group has since graced world-renowned stages including the White House, Madison Square Garden, Carnegie Hall, and the Broadway stage, with appearances ranging from TIME's Person of the Year Awards, the TODAY Show, ANA/ANCC Magnet Pathway Conference, Live with Kelly and Ryan, HTLH, and multiple

professional sporting events – just to name a few. There was also music throughout the evening performed by the Washington Adventist University (WAU) Faculty String Quartet and Soprano, Ana Aguilar. The WAU music department has musical groups that have performed around the world at such venues as Lincoln Center, Plovdiv Symphony Hall, Carnegie Hall, and special performances honoring Pope Francis and President Obama.

But what was most important that evening was the Lifetime Achievement Honoree, Francis S. Collins, M.D., Ph.D. Dr. Collins is a geneticist and physician who served as director of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) for 12 years under three presidents. Prior to his leadership at NIH he was the director of the National Center for Human Genome Research, where he was responsible for the Human Genome Project, an international scientific research project with the goal of mapping and sequencing all the genes of the human genome. Completed in 2003, the resulting detailed knowledge is providing new avenues for advances in medicine and biotechnology. As leader of NIH his team took on projects that include the BRAIN initiative, the All of Us Research Program, the sound Health Initia-

tive, and the National Cancer Moonshot Initiative, as well as programs to encourage diversity and equity in biomedical research. We were privileged to honor this exceptional leader, curious researcher, and determined innovator, whose unparalleled commitment to advancing the cause of health and strengthening the bonds of cooperation inspires us all. His wife Diane Baker was also recognized in her role as supporter and encourager of all endeavors of Dr. Collins. The response from Dr. Collins kept the audience spell bound for 15 minutes enamored with his insights and projection of future possibilities in improving global health.

We also honored the 10 hospitals still operating that were part of the original 17 that organized what was the Hospital Council in May of 1946 and now The Healthcare Council. They all participated in the gala video giving their storied history from then to now.



For the first time in our 75-year history we launched a scholarship program in honor of our late board member Dr. Omega Logan Silva. Dr. Silva served as trustee of The Healthcare Council with distinction for 20 years, and she had a passion for encouraging economically disadvantaged women to pursue a degree in healthcare—a cause she supported throughout her entire career. Her niece, Garlette Logan Jordan shared memories about her aunt. Omega's husband Harold Webb was a guest at the gala in support of the scholarship program.

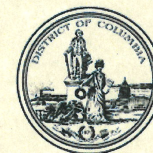




THE OMEGA LOGAN SILVA SCHOLARSHIP FUND LAUNCHED

Valley Health's Acute Care Hospitals Earn National Recognition For Patient Safety: Valley Health's two acute care hospitals – Winchester Medical Center (WMC) and Warren Memorial Hospital (WMH) -- have each earned an "A" Hospital Safety Grade from The Leapfrog Group, an independent, non-profit national watchdog organization, recognizing their achievements in protecting patients from harm in the hospital setting. The Leapfrog Group assigned an "A," "B," "C," "D," or "F" grade to nearly 3,000 general acute care hospitals across the country based on over 30 evidence-based patient safety performance measures reflecting errors, injuries, accidents and infections, as well as systems in place to prevent harm.



Sentara Healthcare Continues Investment In Team Members With Merit Pay Increases: Sentara Healthcare, the Commonwealth of Virginia's largest integrated health system and one of its largest employers, announced on May 20 it is implementing a 3% merit pay increase for all eligible team members, up to and including the director level, effective May 22. This merit increase follows a 5% market pay increase announced in February, and is part of a \$125M investment in pay increases and new/enhanced benefits announced earlier this year. In 2021, Sentara invested more than \$185 million in team member compensation increases, appreciation gifts and other COVID-related compensation programs. Combined with the raises and benefit enhancements announced this year, the system's added contributions in 2021 and 2022 will total more than \$310 million.
